Honduras Dental Service Trip

- Dr. Albert from UConn Dental School, service trip taking place March 24th-March 31st
- Private practitioner in Connecticut, went to UConn undergrad with a major in Chemistry, then went to Farmington for UConn dental school, and completed a 2 year residency at UConn as well. He specialized in pediatric dentist and then went to teach at UConn Dental School.
 - He taught head, neck anatomy and then got involved with the mentor program, also teaching business management to 4th years, all while running his own private practice
 - After his first year of teaching he got asked to go on a trip to the Amazon for a week of service, has been on 26 trips with third year dental school ever since
- Comyagua, Honduras in the Spring, started in 2011
 - Fly into San Pedro Sula
 - Mission Statement: The purpose of the dental service projects is to primarily help provide dental care to underserved communities and secondarily to support the education mission of the SDM.
 - Location Criteria: Established, government approved agency on-site, safe affordable, value to the community
 - Beach day to Tela and National Park
 - The role of the undergraduate: observe, assist, and learn (1 doctor and 2 undergraduate students)
 - The hotel that they stay in is a gated area so very safe
 - Working in a church, using cots as the dental chair
 - Restorative, extractions, root canal therapy, sterilization of instruments, portable x-ray unit
 - Two hygienists go along as well
 - Interest is to provide kind care to all the people there
 - If you are interested in a trip and it fills up then Dr. Albert can try and get you on a different smaller trip with other people at the school
 - 13 dental students, 6 dentists, 6-7 undergraduates
 - The undergraduates stay with one doctor all week and stay at the station while the dental students shift around
